Dear Chairman Jaczko and Commissioners Svinicki, Magwood, Apostolakis and Ostendorff:

We write to urge you to quickly move to adopt the recommendations of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC's) Near Term Task Force reviewing NRC processes and regulations in the wake of the Fukushima nuclear meltdowns. We believe that doing so is vital to ensuring the safety of nuclear reactors in this country.

The NRC's Near-Term Task Force was comprised of 6 senior NRC officials¹, who together have more than 135 years of nuclear regulatory expertise. Last month, the Task Force transmitted its report to the Commission, and presented a specific set of recommendations for near-term Orders, rulemakings that should be initiated, and items that should be further studied in order to determine the best course of action in response to the Fukushima melt-downs. These include commonsense measures such as:

- requirements to upgrade nuclear reactor protections for severe events (and combinations of events) such as earthquakes, tsunamis, fires or floods;
- requirements to strengthen protections against the sort of catastrophic loss of electricity that caused the meltdowns in Japan, including a requirement for reactor cores and spent nuclear fuel to be cooled for up to 72 hours following such a blackout;
- requirements for technologies to prevent or mitigate against the sort of hydrogen explosions that occurred in Japan;
- requirements to strengthen the currently voluntary emergency mitigation procedures for nuclear crises; and
- increased NRC oversight and enforcement of these regulations.

We understand that Chairman Jaczko has issued a proposal for how the Commission should consider these recommendations. This proposal includes meetings with external stakeholders, three full Commission meetings, and input from additional NRC staff and the NRC's Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards. He also proposed that the Commission determine, one way or the other, how it planned to proceed on each

of the Task Force's recommendations by October 21 – 90 days after the publication of the report that itself took 90 days to prepare. We support the Chairman's proposal for the timeframe and process for consideration of these recommendations, and additionally urge you to support their adoption.
